- c. Treasurer's Report J. Staats:
  - i. Columbia Bank logins have changed, J. Staats is working on regaining access. No report at this time.
- d. Administrator's Report M. Ballance:
  - i. Poor attendance this month due to illnesses and viruses (children, staff, staff children, etc.). 86-89% currently compared to the standard 92-96%. Parent club provided fantastic food for the fall conferences, everyone was much appreciated. Read-a-thon raised \$4,000 for literacy projects. 8 Oregon Battle of the Books (OBOB) teams. There is now funding for books and team shirts. Angel Tree donations were able to provide food and gifts for 11 families. Peer Helpers helped assemble food boxes for the Angel Tree. S. Priem would like to send thank you cards to the Peer Helpers from the board. School nutrition audit coming up on January 10th. They will audit what OSD does, but since we're a separate school they'll treat us as such. Dr. Ballance is negotiating with them on what is needed as we contract our food services from OSD. Updated EAGLE Charter School Wellness Policy, only change was dates and personnel names. iReady second assessment is in January. Standardized (OSAS) testing is in May for 3rd-5th. 5th grade will have an additional test for Science. No current student government in place, working on formal changes to get back in place. J. Staats brought up the need to provide recommendations to parents regarding Internet, Social Media, and texting issues regarding children with technology and to help curb cyberbullying.

- i. Had a good meeting with the representative from Fidelity. Opening an account and moving the funds costs nothing. Having the funds managed would cost somewhere between 0.3% and 1% based on the simplicity of the investment. Fidelity provided good information to J. Staats and W. Andersen. Conservative is bond-oriented, but bonds don't protect from inflation. Bonds right now are the riskiest investment you can get because of their current performance and relationship with inflation rates. Only have a few changes to the charter before it should be ready. Remove wording against investing in specific categories (like oil drilling companies), move towards a more diversified investment fund. Should be a ban on Cryptocurrency investments at this time due to the volatility of the crypto market and the funds being state funds. There still needs to be discussions concerning whether we pay for funds management or move towards a diversification plan like S&P 500.
- b. Status of ODE's intergovernmental agreement for OSBA services: Needed to complete weapons policy based on discussion from Sep Board meeting.
  - i. Still being held up by ODE. Also found that we are not getting policy updates from OSBA as well.
